ED PRICKETT 1983 - 2004

Athletics in Surrey has suffered a tragic blow with the death in a road accident in the North-East on Sunday May 2 of former Epsom College pupil Ed Prickett.

Ed, who was just 21, was one of Britain's most promising young runners, competing in the European junior cross country championships in Croatia in 2002. He was the second British runner to cross the finishing line.

He was in Gateshead competing in the annual British Universities track and field championships, and although he was not racing on Sunday, the day of the accident, he was there supporting the Nottingham University men's team as their captain. It occurred when he was struck by a car outside Gateshead International Stadium while taking a break from watching the athletics. On the Saturday, he had easily won his 5000m heat, and, Mick Wood, director of UK Athletics Endurance Performance Centre at St Mary's University College, Twickenham, was confident he would win the final.

While at Epsom College, he joined his local club, Reigate Priory, and steadily improved winning the 5000m title at the AAA Junior Championships in 2001. That year, he was ranked second in both the UK junior 3000 and 5000m lists. Last year, he was ranked third and sixth among Britain's under 23 athletes over 3000 and 5000m.

Initially, he made his mark as a cross country runner winning the Surrey colts title in 1996, the boys title in 1998, the youths title in 2000 and then the junior title three years on the trot from 2001 to 2003.

After winning the short course silver medal at the BUSA cross country championships in Dundee in February, Prickett went altitude training at the same South African venue as Sam Haughian, the former Kingston College student, who died in a road accident near Johannesburg, 10 days before.

As news of Prickett's accident spread through the stunned stadium at Gateshead, floral tributes appeared beside the road where he had died. The third and final day of the championships on Monday only went ahead after the organisers and officials from the Nottingham University team agreed to do so as a tribute to Prickett. There was a minute's silence before the first event on the day's programme which was, by a cruel twist of fate, the men's 5000m final. Many of the competitors wore black armbands and the winner Andrew Lemoncello from Stirling spoke for all when he said he was "stunned" and finding it hard to believe what had happened.

Martin Goodway, president of Surrey County AA, who had watched Prickett develop into a top runner in his role as one of the county's cross country team managers, was devastated by the news. "He was just at the beginning of what looked like being a successful athletics career. He was doing so well. This is quite awful news."

Dave Moorcroft, UK Athletics Chief Executive, said: "This is the second terrible tragedy in a week where one of our best young distance running talents has died in an awful accident. It is difficult to imagine what Ed's family and close friends are going through now but the thoughts of everyone in athletics is with them at this awful time."

All four, just a fraction of a large training group, have between them in recent years amassed UK, AAA and English Schools titles too numerous to mention. Included in past successes was Louise Brunning one of Britain's foremost 400m hurdlers.

Les became involved with Mitcham AC some 30 years ago and one of his earliest roles was as team manager for their women who at the time went on to become arguably the finest team in the country.
